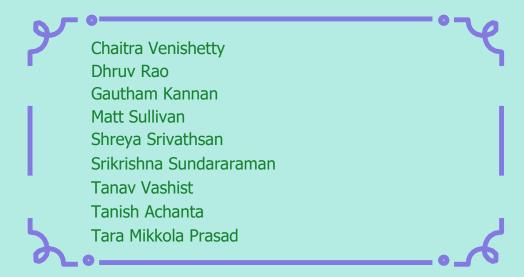

All about Mount Everest

Here's to what you should know about the beautiful mountain, Mount Everest.

It is the highest point in the world. Everest is located at the border of Nepal & Tibet, an ancient Chinese country. Nepal is a small country, near India. The Everest is 29,035 ft. over the sea's summit. The first ever two people who successfully climbed Everest are Sir Edmund Hillary, and Sherpa Tenzing Norgay. Well, Sherpas are people who live near the mountain. They are excellent guides, and they are very intelligent too. They can help you throughout your climb, as well. They are very courteous too. Everest's Nepalese (the language that most Nepal people speak) is Sagarmatha, meaning "sky" & "head". There isn't much oxygen at the summit (meaning at the top) of Everest.
